Greater coordination across branches and trades

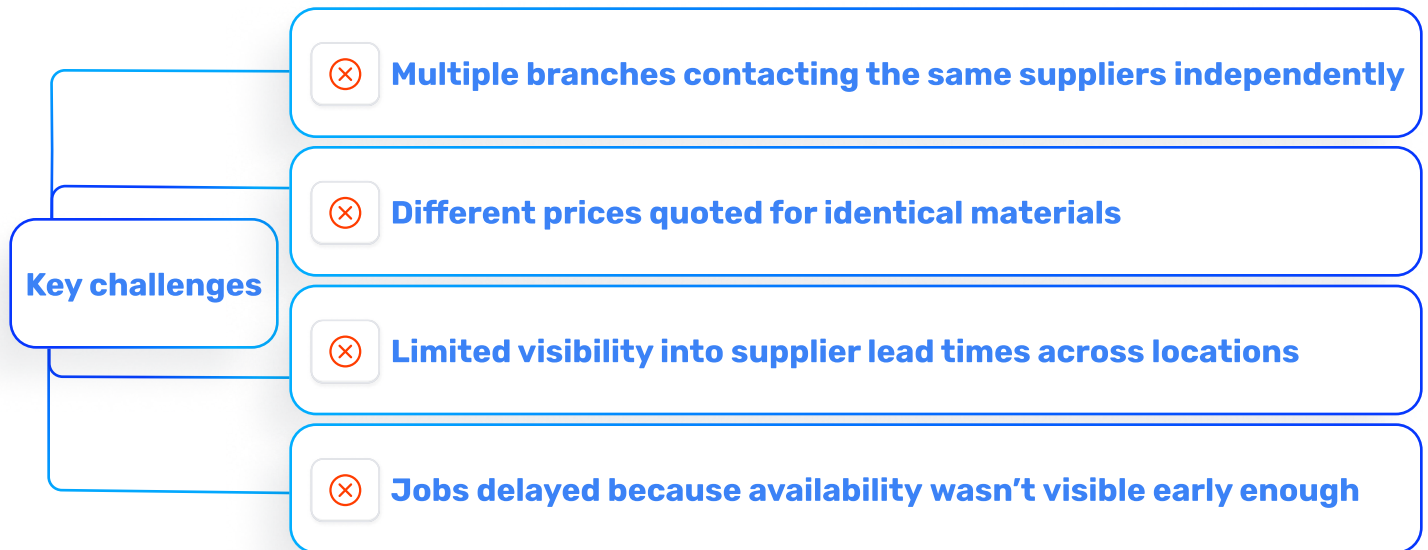
Without structure, procurement work expands unevenly. You find yourself chasing quotes, following up repeatedly, and reshuffling schedules as materials arrive late or out of sequence.

When branches operate in isolation, suppliers become overloaded, pricing varies, and material delays ripple through project schedules.

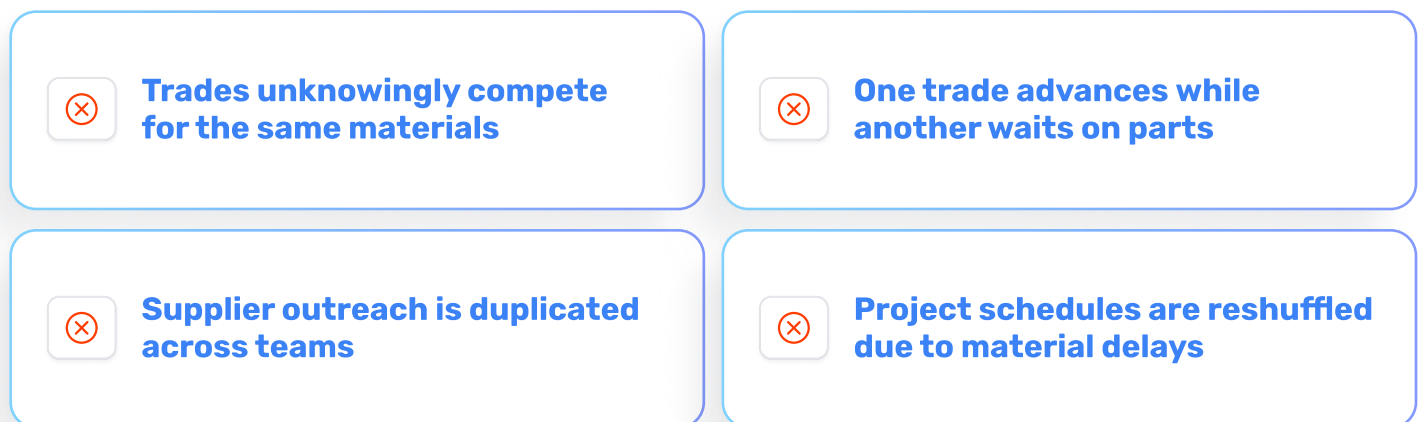

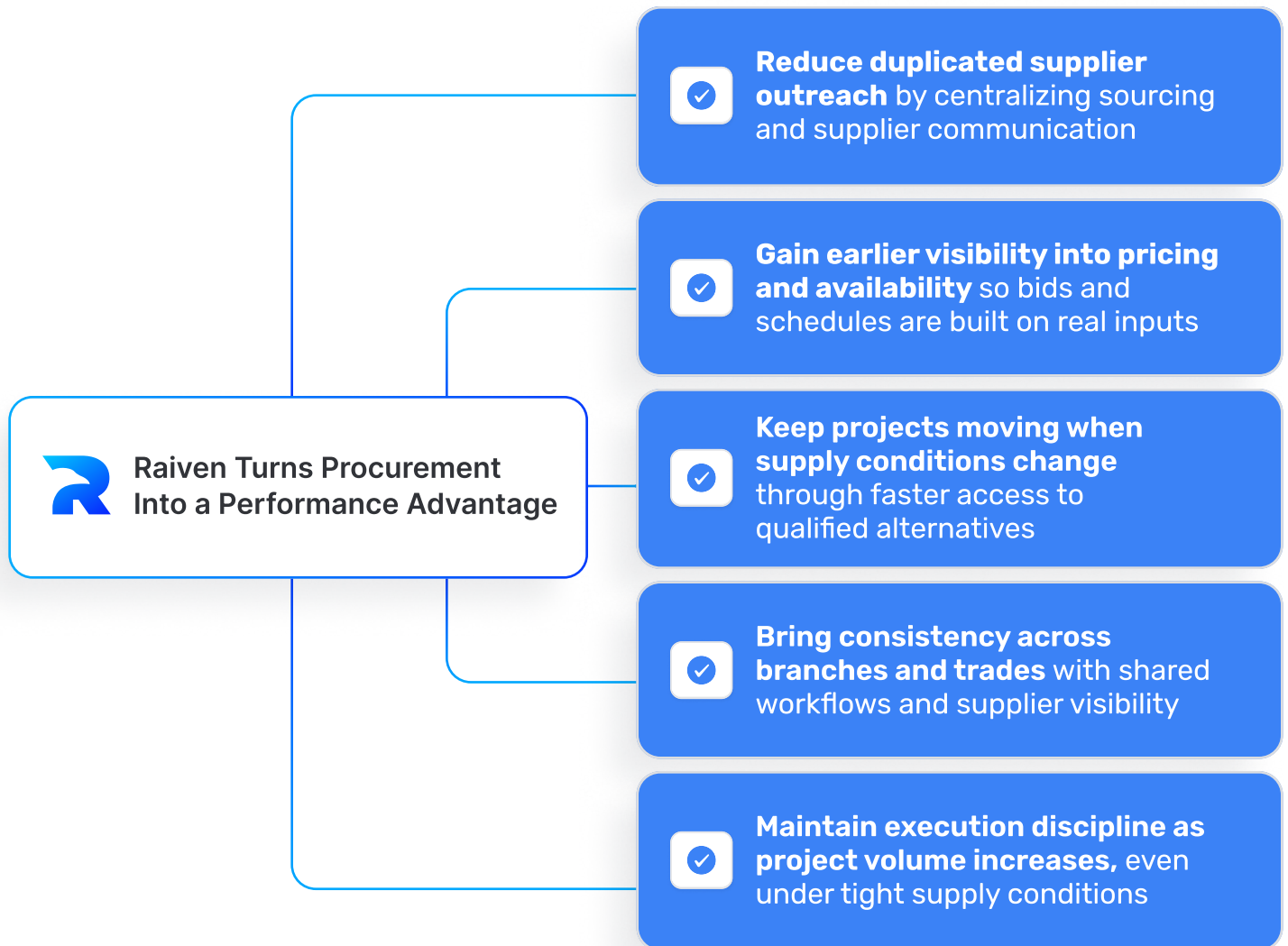
